- Must have a vehicle, 4 volunteers maximum.

• Garden Care | Daily | Daytime and Evening Hours

Ministry Overview:

By The Hand Club For Kids is a faith-based after-school program that emphasizes academic excellence while nurturing the whole child — mind, body and soul. By The Hand serves more than 1,500 first- through 12th-graders in Chicago's under-resourced neighborhoods.

After school — when most crimes against kids are committed — By The Hand mentors and tutors children in a safe environment; provides for their physical well-being with nutritious meals and health care, including dental check-ups and cleanings and eye exams; and invites



them into the good news of the Gospel. In 2019, 71% of By The Hand graduates enrolled in college, 83% professed faith in Jesus and 100% received warm and nutritious meals daily.

Potential Serve Opportunities for Rooted Groups:

- After-School Club | Monday through Thursday each week | 4:00 7:00 p.m.
 - Volunteer at By The Hand's after-school program in Chicago's Austin neighborhood. Groups will provide homework help, work with students on a reading program, serve meals and join kids in fellowship. The goal: create an environment where kids are known, loved and equipped to thrive.

Ministry Overview:

Looking for a way to serve those in need right here in our community? Consider volunteering at the Salvation Army with the Christ Church Food Pantry team!

In 2004, a group of Christ Church members felt a stirring to serve the struggling families in our area. In the 17 years since, the Food Pantry Team has provided food and clothing to well over 60,000 men, women and children. This lay-led team of Christ Church volunteers partners monthly with the Salvation Army in Oakbrook Terrace to serve the needs of local families — often 100 or more in a single morning — with food, clothing, shoes, Bibles, fellowship and prayer.

Potential Serve Opportunities for Rooted Groups:

The Food Pantry takes place on **the second Saturday of every month** at 1 S. 415 Summit Avenue in Oakbrook Terrace from 8:00 - 11:15 a.m. On the day of the pantry, the Christ Church team distributes food to guests, helps carry groceries out to cars and assists in clean-up.

There are a number of ways to serve the Food Pantry throughout throughout the week preceding the Pantry (although contact with clients is only possible on Saturday):



- Thursday | 5:45 6:15 p.m. | Loading racks of food out of the Butterfield building and into the truck for transport to the Salvation Army
- Friday | 1:30 4:00 p.m. | Setup at the Salvation Army
- Saturday | 7 a.m. 11:15 a.m. | Food Pantry at the Salvation Army
 - PRAYER & CARE TEAM: Additionally, a Rooted group could serve together as a "Prayer and Care" team at the Pantry, meeting clients and praying for them and their needs.

Food and Clothing Supplies Sorting

- Much of the Food Pantry's food and clothing is provided through donations to Christ Church's various drives. These items must be sorted and organized prior to distribution. Rooted groups are invited to try an exciting and invaluable two-pronged Serve Experience: Assist in sorting one day, then attend the Pantry to distribute the items to families! Ministry Overview:

Trafficking and exploitation of men and boys continue to grow at an unprecedented rate, both in Chicago and around the world. Contrary to popular perception, 36% of those victimized by the sex trade are men. However, because men are typically viewed as oppressors rather than victims, there are virtually no services available to male victims and survivors of trafficking and exploitation. They are often overlooked, misunderstood, stereotyped, ignored and left without support. Facing this challenge requires strategy, innovation, collaboration and prayer.

Emmaus Ministries builds Christ-centered relationships of trust with men in survival prostitution on the streets of Chicago, helping them to rebuild their lives. They also partner with law enforcement to address the root causes of trafficking and exploitation and cut off the cycle before it starts.



Potential Serve Opportunity for Rooted Groups:

Immersion Night | Friday or Saturday Nights, 10 p.m. and later

- Volunteers travel downtown and meet with Emmaus staff at a central location in the city, then travel together to some of the neighborhoods Emmaus serves.
- Christ Church members "shadow" the Emmaus staff as they perform street outreach to the men they encounter. The team provides the love of Christ, meals, practical help in escaping the sex trade and the hope of a brighter future.
- Immersion nights allow volunteers to experience the settings where survival prostitution takes place and gain a new perspective, building awareness of the need and developing a heart to help.

Opportunities for ongoing service:

- Building care packs (distributed to men on the streets)
- Contribute skilled assistance with legal, accounting, and other needs
- Emmaus also provides training (documentary and discussion) for those interested in learning more about the ministry.
- Comments from Emmaus staff:
 - "Many people are incredulous when they first hear about the problems we're trying to address. They can't believe that such circumstances exist. But when you come downtown and imagine yourself as a 16-year-old from rural Illinois who arrives in the city on a bus with nothing and no one to turn to, the path so many take into this cycle becomes more clear. This is an opportunity to learn, engage, ask questions, and then develop a heart of mercy for a group of people that most people do not see."
 - "This is not your typical serve opportunity, so there is a certain amount of risk. But in our 30 years of doing this work, we've never had any issues with safety and none of our staff or volunteers have ever been harmed. In addition to using 'street smarts' as we engage with the neighborhood, we have been blessed that the Lord continues to care for and protect our ministry."

Founded in 1877, Pacific Garden Mission (PGM) is the oldest continuously operating Gospel rescue mission in the country. PGM meets the physical needs of Chicago's homeless and hurting men, women and children 365 days a year — serving 2,000 hot, nutritious meals and sheltering more than 400 people each day.

PGM also nurtures emotional and spiritual well-being through transformational, Christ-focused programs and care that help people discover Jesus, beat addiction, restore families and move toward flourishing. Beyond Chicago, PGM makes an impact for Christ with TV and YouTube programming and the award-winning radio drama, "UNSHACKLED!"

Potential Serve Opportunities for Rooted Groups:

- Groups of 10-20 can assist with food service and have fellowship with guests over meals served.

Ministry Overview:

Resilient is a Christian Community Development organization born from the missions ministry of Christ Church as part of the "Take Root" initiative. Launched into independence as its own



501(C)3 in 2018, Resilient provides opportunities for youth and families in pockets of suburban poverty just minutes from Christ Church's two campuses.

Resilient envisions a community where all children gain self-worth and thrive despite challenging circumstances. Their in-school mentoring programs come alongside and support elementary and high school students. And their new "Upstart" program connects non-college-bound students with professional mentors, helping them learn the skills required to seek a rewarding, lucrative career in the construction trades — with unique opportunities to enter a trade apprenticeship program.

Resilient also supports adults with computer and literacy classes and offers free "Thursday Night Meals" for community members in need.

Potential Serve Opportunities for Rooted Groups:

(NOTE: For the safety of the students being served, all Resilient volunteers must undergo a background check and be fully vaccinated for COVID-19.)

- "Third Thursday" Meals | New Life Community Church | 136 E Highland Ave, Villa Park, IL 60181
 - Resilient is seeking volunteers to help with the Thursday Night Meals, serving dinner monthly to students, families and neighbors in need of nourishment.
 Dinners also include presentations on life skills from various experts, prayer support and Bible distribution.
 - Thursday Dinners take place at New Life Community Church in Villa Park on the third Thursday of each month. Volunteers will help with setting up the meals, assist with serving and clean-up, and spend time chatting and praying with the people in attendance.
 - Meals are served outside during warm weather, but when cold weather arrives, meals will either move indoors or transition to drive-through, depending on local COVID numbers. Check with Dagmar Porcelli at information above for details.

Ministry Overview:

World Relief DuPage/Aurora works to foster a movement among local churches to create welcoming communities where refugees and immigrants thrive. In partnership with the local church, World Relief works to see the most vulnerable people transformed economically, socially, and spiritually. In the wake of the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan, World Relief is on the front lines assisting Afghan refugees in our area.

Potential Serve Opportunities for Rooted Groups:

NOTE: Due to high volumes of volunteer applicants responding to the Afghan evacuation, it may take a week or more to provide next steps for certain volunteer roles.

One-Time Opportunities

- **Transportation Assistant:** Welcome and empower refugees as they access new places, whether it's picking them up from the airport upon arrival or helping them get to various appointments.
- Apartment Set-up Assistant: Create a welcoming environment for refugees and immigrants in their new homes by delivering and setting up household items.

Ongoing Opportunities

- Youth Tutor: Build relationships by coming alongside a refugee or immigrant youth and their parent(s) as they adjust to homework, school, and parenting in the U.S. in the midst of the pandemic.
- **English Language Tutor:** Practice conversational English and language skills with an adult refugee or immigrant, becoming friends in the process! (Note: Language tutors must be Illinois residents due to funding stipulations).
- Young Adult Mentor: Mentor a young adult refugee as they prepare for the next step in their higher education or career path, building their confidence and your relationship in the process.
- Health Advocate: Provide friendship and support to a refugee or asylee individual or family who is facing extra challenges or barriers to receiving the services they need, or is simply experiencing additional stress under COVID.
- **Citizenship Tutor:** Assist immigrants in preparing for their citizenship interview and exam in a one-on-one or small group setting. Held on various evenings/Saturday mornings at partner sites both in-person and virtually across our DuPage and Aurora suburban locations.
